

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTION #1



Q: Now that Jonathan is retired, when will we get a new Senior Pastor?

A: We believe God has clearly said two things: “*What do you have in your hand?*” and “*Be patient*”. We have begun to explore what we have in our hand and we are trying to be patient. We do not envisage ever putting an ad for a new Senior Pastor in Christianity Today magazine – we are such a relational church that we don’t think this would work. The leadership team and wider church family have many relational links to other churches and networks and God may choose to bring someone to us through one of these. This is likely to take time. We have also been advised by wise leaders outside 3CC (including Pete Gilbert) to be open to different shapes of leadership: this could be a traditional full time Senior Pastor, a couple operating together as Senior Pastors or a different team-based model.
